THE PASTOR'S PEN **APRIL 2017**

There are a lot of strange holidays that we celebrate during the year.

For example, on October 21 there is Sweetest Day, which is a variation of Valentine's Day. People are supposed to perform romantic deeds or expressions. There is Pi Day on March 14, because the first three numbers of the mathematical constant are 3.14. Pies are usually eaten. And then there is Everything You Do Is Right Day, March 16. That one caught my attention, as I was listening to my radio station over the Internet. The announcer never had heard of such a day, but he decided to highlight it nonetheless. I looked it up and got this quote, "Everything You Do is Right Day just might be a perfect day... Some days are good days. Some days are bad days... Every once in a while, a day comes along where everything you do goes well....the perfect day!"

Actually, we have the perfect day, and it is Easter. It is not the day in which everything we do is right. It is the day in which we are made right through the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

We could say we have experienced perfect days, wonderful days in which we enjoyed every hour. The weather was as we wanted it. The activities and fellowship were spot on. We could not have asked for a better day, so we declare it to be perfect. However, and I am sorry to rain on your parade, but just because we declare a day to be perfect doesn't mean we are perfect. We can never be perfect as long as we live in this flesh on this earth. Sin is not those bad things we do; sin is the state we constantly live in. "Full of all wickedness, distrust, contempt and hatred of God.' the Second Helvetic Confession says, "we are unable to do or even to think anything good for ourselves" (5.037). "All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God," Romans 3:23 says.

We are tainted, polluted, way over our heads in sin. We could declare one day to be "Everything You Do is Right," and yet there is sin infecting us. There are still people who will do bad things even on March 16 that break confidences and shatters lives. We may think what we do that day is alright, but we still may hurt people in one manner or another.

Having said all that, we do have one day in the year in which we declare as perfect. Easter. The day is perfect only because of the perfect act of our Savior, Jesus Christ. Jesus perfectly died, so that we may be cleaned, healed, restored from our sin. Jesus perfectly rose, so that we may be brought back to a complete and uninterrupted relationship with our God. Jesus is perfect, and makes all our days perfect for growing in faith through our worship, study, and serving.

Easter is not Everything You Do Is Right Day; it is Everything Is Made Right through Christ Day. Everything and everyone, and the door to eternal salvation is open to us, and the path is laid down for us to travel toward that door. We are redeemed. All our bad and good days are restored. We "rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation" (Romans 5:11).
