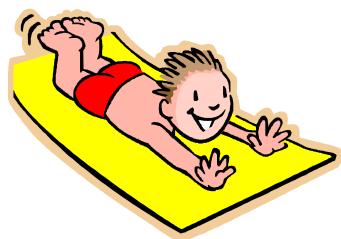

The Pastor's Pen



I read a funny cartoon, in which the dean of a college asks a student to his office. The dean says that he needs to go, because he has spent too much time at college. The student doesn't want to go, so he argues that he should stay according to Thomas Jefferson's perspective on college. "Mr. Jefferson believed colleges shouldn't even grant degrees, that students should just stay until they felt educated," the student says. "I see," the dean says, "and when do you anticipate feeling educated?" "One more year," the student says, and the dean agrees. He can stay in college one more year! Back in his dorm room, the student says to his roommate, "Yo, it worked! Who's Thomas Jefferson?" The roommate, playing his Xbox, says, "The dude on the nickel."

For some reason, this reminds me of boundaries. We need them. We need to know how long we have to do things, and when they are due. We need to know when we have to be at a certain place. We need to know what we can or cannot talk about with friends or strangers. There are certain foods we'd love to eat but cannot for health reasons; and there are foods we cannot stand the smell of, so we will never eat them. Some of the boundaries we have to abide by are natural. We cannot simply fall off a building and think we will survive. We cannot live under the water without scuba gear or a submarine.

As much as we may hate certain boundaries, especially the ones imposed on us, we have to follow them. We should follow them, or we might end up paying the consequences that are far worse than abiding by the boundaries.

We have spiritual boundaries, too. We do not believe in any ole god, but the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. We do not believe there are several spirits out there that can lead us in any direction, but believe in only one Holy spirit who gives and provides life. We do not believe anybody can save us, but only Christ can and does save.

Paul once spoke to the Corinthians about boundaries. They had a motto: "All things are lawful for me." Do whatever you want, because it feels good. Their motto justified their immoral behavior, but if they were going to follow Christ they had to adhere to boundaries. Not everything is "lawful" for us, because many things draw us away from God. They draw us away from any relationship we have with Christ. We become slaves to those immoral desires, and then we find ourselves in trouble.

If we follow Christ, then our bodies belong to Christ, Paul tells the Corinthians. We cannot fill our bodies with whatever we want. We fill our bodies with the things of God, and those things motivate us to do all for his glory. Not only our bodies, but our minds, our spirits, our feelings, and our thoughts belong to Christ. Paul said to the Corinthians to glorify God in your bodies and in your spirit, which are possessions of God's (1 Corinthians 6:20).

Some boundaries we may fight. We may try to change the boundaries to suit our needs, and we may do so at our own peril. But there are some boundaries we are thankful for: The relationship we have with God, the households we live in with loving fathers and/or mothers, the activities we participate in after school or in our spare time, the ministries we accomplish that give others support and encouragement. We like those boundaries. We are blessed in those boundaries, and would do nothing to change them.

"Lord, you have assigned me my portion and my cup; you have made my lot secure. The boundary lines have fallen for me in pleasant places; surely I have a delightful inheritance" (Psalm 16:5-6).
