

## In Memory of Rev. Tom Dews - Pastor Emeritus



**Rev. Thomas M. Dews**, Pastor of Morrow Presbyterian Church from May 1970 until April 1982, and MPC's Pastor Emeritus, died on May 25, 2011, at the age of 93.

Rev. Dews was born in Nashville, TN on July 1, 1917. He is survived by his wife, Freida Smith Dews of Covington, Ga., three children: Thomas M. Dews, Jr. (Katherine) of Silver Spring, Maryland, James Tye Dews (Susan) of Sioux City, S.D. and Julie Dews (Bob Warren) of Montreat, NC; five grandchildren and five great grandchildren, a sister, Catherine Dews Jenkins of Blakely, GA and many beloved nieces and nephews. He also had three stepchildren: Karen Burdell (Chuck) of Conyers, GA, Jimmy Mobley (Sherry) of Irwinville, GA and Larry Mobley (Debra) of Ocilla, Ga. as well as six step-grandchildren and six step great grandchildren. He was greatly loved by all his family and friends. He was preceded in death by his wife of 40 years, Virginia Tye Dews, who died in 1984.

When Rev. Dews became pastor of MPC in 1970, our Sunday School began to expand, new classes were formed, and remodeling began. Several Boy and Girl Scout Troops

were sponsored by the church and our Young-At-Heart was organized. Due to increased membership, an enlarged sanctuary, a multi-purpose room, and more classrooms were soon required. The first Sunday in the completed facilities was April 10, 1977. Rev. Dews retired from the Pastorate in April 1982, and became our Pastor Emeritus.

After Pastor Dews retired, he served as Chaplin of Calvin Center in Hampton, GA. He was a member of Grace Covenant Presbyterian Church in Covington, GA, where he was active and often preached until recently.

He will be dearly missed.

## The Pastor's Pen



Monday, May 23, 2011

This morning, I drove past a billboard that had been warning us of the Judgment Day on May 21 for the last three weeks. It was quickly replaced with a McDonald's advertisement of a colorful frozen drink and the words *Una Fiesta Limonfrescona*, a very fresh lemon party. Life moves on...

To be sure, May 21 was the end of the world for those who passed on from a long illness or an unexpected accident. People die every day, and some of them happened to die this last Saturday. Their families are still mourning, trying to cope with such bad news, trying to move forward with their lives without that special person.

For most of the population who did not pass on to another life, we could mock the predictions of one person and call him a fool. We could quote passages such as Matthew 24:23-28 and 24:36-44, and pat ourselves on the back for such firm arguments. Or, we could consider the presence of God. Where is God, up there in some heaven far away or right here in our problems and successes?

In John 14, Jesus is talking about preparing places for his disciples in heaven, when Thomas asks, "Lord, we don't know where you are going. How can we know the way?" (John 14:5). Jesus responds with words that might be very familiar to us, but notice the verb he uses. He says, "I am the way and the truth and the life." Not "I will be," but "I am," present tense. Thomas is worried about finding a way that he may come to at the end of his life, while Jesus is talking about a Reality that Thomas may grasp immediately.

When Jesus visits the woman at the well, she tells him that she believes the Messiah is coming one day; and when Jesus meets Martha after her brother Lazarus dies, she says she believes he will rise again in the resurrection at the last day (cf. John 4:25 and 11:24). Jesus tells the woman at the well, "I who you speak to *am* he," and he tells Martha, "I am the resurrection and the life." Again, present tense. Not something that will eventually happen, but something that is happening right here, right now.

God is here, not will be here. God the Father is here offering us everlasting life through Christ the Son, not will be when the time is ripe. God is with us now, not will be when we get our lives straightened out, not will be when the job comes and the money flows, not will be when we can learn how to love and forgive, not will be when we can feel better about ourselves. God is right here, right now, in the thick and thin, in the pits and on the mountains. I AM, Jesus says.

A young seminarian's pastor/mentor was dying. He had been the seminarian's mother's youth pastor when she was young, and he had helped the young man enter seminary and work toward ordination. He was standing at bedside in the hospital. Amid tubes and wires coming from nose and chest the mentor said: "I have bad news and good news to tell you. The bad news is that I have the big C, cancer, and it's terminal, and I have two weeks to live." This tore the seminarian's heart in two, and he wept bitterly. After several minutes, the sick pastor/mentor said, "I have good news, and it is I have the big C, and it's terminal, and I have two weeks to go before I get to see the Lord. I finally get to see what I've been living for every day of my life."

At least one good thing came from last Saturday: All of us thought a little bit more about Jesus.
