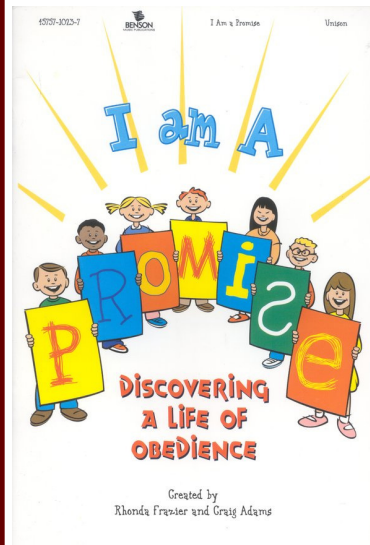

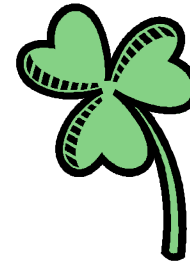

The Pastor's Pen



(Ten years ago, I wrote this Pastor's Pen to another congregation in PA. In light of the race that was held in Daytona on the anniversary of Earnhardt's death, I thought I'd reprint it...)

In February, a tragic event occurred in the Nascar racing world. One of its greatest competitors, Dale Earnhardt, was killed in an accident on the last turn of the Daytona 500. To witness the accident itself, one may think the impact of his car was not that severe. Other cars have slammed into walls of other racetracks, and the drivers lived to tell about it. Dale Earnhardt never got the chance to tell about his accident. An investigation determined that his seatbelt broke away, which shouldn't have happened, and his body moved forward in the seat with the motion of the impact. At 180 miles per hour, he smacked his chin against the steering wheel, knocking him out and crushing the back part of his head and spine. In a twinkling of an eye, a man lost his life doing something he loved to do.

We never know when the kingdom will come. We do not know when God will call us to join with him in the kingdom's splendor and festivity. One accident, one turn of events, can change our carefully drawn-out plans... and then, where will we find ourselves? Will we go home to heaven, or find ourselves lost further than we were on earth?

The season of Lent is a time for reflection. It is a time to take an inventory of our lives and determine how our relationship stands with God. It is a time to consider where our paths are leading us, to heaven, or to you-know-where?

Of course, every day we should strengthen our relationship with God through prayer, devotional reading and study, worship, and actions reflecting God's love. God continues to strengthen his relationship with us each day through his infinite blessings. During Lent, we walk with Jesus as he journeyed to Jerusalem, to the Temple, to Gethsemane, and finally to the cross. We listen to Jesus' words, we observe Jesus' life, and we are drawn closer to Jesus because we want to receive everything he has to offer. We live as God's chosen people, special citizens on the kingdom today. We shouldn't have to worry about the events of the next minute or of tomorrow, *if* we already know Jesus to be our Savior and believe our lives will be with God someday.

"Lo! I tell you a mystery," Paul said to his Corinthians friends, "in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet, we shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed" (1Cor. 15:51-52). That is our hope as Christians. That is what we anticipate, as we gather with our Lord in warm fellowship, day in and day out.
