The Pastor's Pen



I love listening to classical music on 90.1FM. I love to hear their programs such as *Car Talk* and *Wait, Wait, Don't Tell Me*. What I don't like is when the station puts on their pledge drive during the fall, interrupting the music I want to hear.

A few years ago, I decided to answer the request. I made the phone call and pledged my money. It felt good to do so. I felt like I was contributing to the station in a large, positive way. At the top of the hour, the hosts thanked everyone who had contributed (not by name but we were thanked nonetheless), and then they announced a challenge for the next hour (200 calls would bring in \$2000 to the station), and that was it. The hosts talked about the benefits of pledging, and that good feeling inside me soon dissipated.

Every time I pledged I felt really good, and then the feeling would die. It seemed as though I was dropping pennies down a well that only made a hollow sound at the bottom. The station would always ask for money and people would always pledge, and the cycle would never stop. How could I add to it and make a difference? Did it really matter if they had my money or not?

Let me tell you that when you tithe to Morrow Church, it makes a huge difference. Every dollar counts.

Your tithe helps to put food on people's tables through the Food Pantry. It puts Christian materials in the hands of our children and youth through Sunday School. It also puts Communicant booklets in the hands of youth who want to join our church on Palm Sunday. It helps in the planning of fun and exciting programs such as the Choir's Christmas Cantata, the children's Christmas and Spring music programs, and Vacation Bible School that has featured the likes of Telly Tickettaker and Godwin Merryfeather.

A portion of your tithe goes to electricity and plumbing, which doesn't seem to mean anything, until you consider the importance of having these things. Electricity and plumbing give the Boy Scouts and Cub Scouts a safe place to meet on Monday and Thursday nights. They allow for children to come to Kids' Club and for youth to come to Youth Group, so they may all have fellowship, worship, and learning. These same children and youth are fed during their Sunday night meetings, since we have to fill the stomach as much as the spirit. Electricity and plumbing offer us an excellent space to worship our Lord every Sunday morning, and even on those special times of Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, and Christmas Eve.

Did you know that Morrow Church tithes to mission projects? If we ask our members to tithe 10% of their income, then the Elders have determined to tithe 10% of the church budget every year. These dollars are distributed between the Thornwell Home, the Uptown Church in the Philippines, the Turk's mission in Madagascar, the Good Shepherd Clinic, the Rainbow House, and the Calvary Refuge Center, just to name a few. Your tithe helps us to stick to this commitment. The dollars go straight out to aid missions that share the love and peace of Jesus Christ with people we may never see.

When you tithe to Morrow Church, it makes a huge difference. Every dollar counts. You will not hear your money dropping into a deep pit, only to make a hollow sound at the bottom. Your generous tithe makes a loud sound that resonates throughout the congregation. Just look around and see the activity. Hear the joyful noise we are making. Let us continue to do so throughout the years.

October has been a very busy month for the Session and the Stewardship & Administration Team. We have been working quite diligently to complete our proposed budget for next year. We are pleased to have completed our work in time for the Session to review and approve the proposed budget. The 2014 Budget will be presented to the congregation soon.

In addition, October has been a reasonably good month for the church financially. The giving for October averaged \$5,464.16 which is very close to what is needed to meet our expenses.
