I'm sure that you've heard the reports on the effect of cellphone usage. With everyone and their brother and sister owning smartphones, experts are concerned that people are becoming less social. We may be reaching out and touching someone we cannot see, but we fail to reach out and touch those right next to us.

I do not want to lift up smartphones as the sole culprit for our social decay. There may be other things that both Googlers and Gutenbergers use on a regular basis. Televisions, computers, portable CD players and their headphones, portable game consoles (and headphones again), even newspapers and magazines and books, as well as tablets and smartphones: Any one of these may ruin a relationship. We can stick our noses in them and completely ignore the people around us. Each one may stop a conversation dead in its tracks or keep a good conversation from ever getting started.

We have many distractions that may ruin relationships, if all we do is pay attention to the distractions. The best time to start engaging others would be right after reading this article. Strike while the iron is hot. Another time would be on Thanksgiving, the major holiday of this month.

Most families gather in one home to stuff themselves with good food. Some family members spend much of the time watching several football games, while some may spend most of the time in the kitchen or dining area. This Thanksgiving, why not silence the smartphone and leave it in our pockets? Why not leave the tablet or videogame console at home, or if it has to come at all, leave the headphones at home? I know this is a scary challenge, but one we can do with God's help. Think less of our needs and more of the needs of others. Think of who we may connect with and what new thing we might find out from them. Look forward to building on relationships with others, not finding every moment to separate from them. Take up the challenge and enjoy.

There is always the alternative: Stay home in your little bubble with your smartphone, eat a peanut butter sandwich and a bag of Doritos instead of turkey and mashed potatoes and cornbread and "The Green Bean Thing," and miss all the fun.

Hanging of the Greens




